## Native American Heritage Month

In the month of November, we celebrate Native American Heritage Month. To kick off this month, we honor one of the most beloved modern day saints, St. Kateri Tekakwitha. Born in 1656 in Auriesville, NY, her mother was part of the Algonquin Tribe of Native Americans. After being captured by the Mohawks and forced to marry their chief, an outbreak of smallpox wreaked havoc on her tribe and family killing most of her relatives and leaving her disfigured. St. Kateri's life changed one day when she heard Jesuit missionaries talking about God in her camp. It was at that time that she fell in love with Christianity becoming a devout Christian spreading the good word, which was very unpopular amongst her tribe. St. Kateri lived a simple and obedient life and satisfied her religious devotions with extreme fasting and penance. St. Kateri died on April 17, 1680, the day before Holy Thursday at 24 years old. After her death, members of her community noticed that her face changed and her disfigurement was gone! St. Kateri was beatified in 1980 and canonized in 2012. She is now recognized as the patron saint of ecology, the environment, Native Americans, and exiled people.






# Scholarships
