Hispanic Heritage Month

Sandra Cisneros is a Mexican author who is best known for her bestselling coming-of-age tale, "The House on Mango Street." As the first Mexican-American author to have her work published by a mainstream publisher, she is heralded as one of the most influential hispanic women in the literary field. Cisneros spent most of her life advocating for at-risk youth. Early in her career, she taught them, and later continued to give back through her work with the Macondo and Alfredo Cisneros del Moral Foundations.
