Hispanic Heritage Month

As we celebrate Hispanic heritage month, today we honor Antonia Novello.

Antonia Coello Novello, M.D., is an American-Puerto Rican who served as a physician and public health administrator in the late 1900s. Born in 1944, in Farjardo, Puerto Rico, she suffered throughout her childhood from a medical condition that could only be corrected with surgery. Because her family could not afford the long trip to the surgical hospital, she spent part of every summer getting interim treatment in a local hospital. It was only after two surgeries, at ages 18 and 20, that the condition was finally corrected. In the meantime, by the time she was a teenager, she had decided to be a doctor, so that she could help other sick children. In her mid 40s, she was appointed vice admiral in the Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and served as the first female- and first Hispanic-Surgeon General of the United States.
